State Aid for Fairs

*From the funds appropriated by the **General Assembly of the State of Tennessee** for the purpose of aiding agricultural fairs in the payment of agricultural premiums, the **Appalachian Fair Association** has been allotted monies by the **Tennessee Department of Agriculture**. *

The officers and directors of the Appalachian Fair wish to express their sincere appreciation to **Governor Bill Lee, Dr. Charles Hatcher, Commissioner of Agriculture, and Lynne Williams, Fair Administrator** for their part in the allocation of these funds.

Appalachian Fair's General Rules & Regulations

To ensure a safe, fun, family-friendly environment, the Appalachian Fair implements these rules and regulations for having the best experience possible!

1. All items brought onto the fairgrounds are subject to search by security.

- 2. Prohibited Items: Selfie sticks Backpacks are discouraged Firearms or weapons of any kind Outside food & beverages. Coolers are not allowed to be brought into the fair. Exceptions may be made for guests with special dietary needs, including but not limited to baby food/formula. NO alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs are allowed Tobacco products are discouraged and NOT allowed in the seating areas or barns Umbrellas are NOT allowed in the seating areas Camping or tailgating chairs are NOT allowed at the concert area NO PETS ALLOWED. Animals are not permitted on the grounds at any time unless they are a part of an authorized show or exhibit. Only trained service dogs assisting the handicapped are allowed on the fairgrounds. We know you love your pets, and we love animals too, but they are not allowed in the fair. This is for their safety as well as the safety of all guests. Guests who use service animals MUST present the animals with their vests on, always retain control of their animals, provide legal papers on the animal, and should keep them on a leash or harness while visiting. Drones are NOT allowed. Any other item deemed unsafe by the Appalachian Fair Security Officials and the Washington County Sheriff's Department.
- **3.** In accordance with FAA regulations and for the safety of our fairgoers, drones and other motorized aircraft systems are prohibited from flying above or near the fairgrounds without prior permission from fair management.
- 4. The Appalachian Fair is a rain or shine event including all events and concerts taking place. NO rainchecks or refunds will be issued. The Appalachian Fair monitors all potentially hazardous weather conditions. In the event the National Weather Service announces a severe weather warning within a 5-mile radius of the fairgrounds, weather advisories will be announced immediately on the public address system and our social media outlets directing guests to seek shelter. Designated severe weather shelters are located in the Farm & Home Building, Building 1, Building 3, the Appalachian Heritage Museum, and the Show Barn. If a concert or special event is taking place, the event will be delayed, postponed, or canceled depending on the severity and duration of the weather event. Fairgoers will be notified of any weather-related announcements via social media and our website www.appalachianfair.com
- 5. Soliciting, selling items, promoting other events, organizations, etc. are strictly prohibited without prior approval from the Appalachian Fair. Unauthorized signs, banners, or posting handbills are not allowed and are strictly prohibited anywhere on the grounds, including the parking fields and surrounding fence areas. All promotions and sales of any kind in and around the fairgrounds must be registered and pre-approved by fair management. - **6.** Shirt & Shoes are REQUIRED. Appropriate attire is always required for a family-friendly atmosphere. Open-toed shoes are not permitted on some rides. See the list of ride requirements on the Drew Exposition page or our website under Entertainment.
- 7. Appropriate conduct should be maintained for a family-friendly atmosphere. Those displaying misappropriate conduct will be asked to leave the grounds or removed from the grounds by security.
- **8.** All property of every character, whether entered for exhibition, display, sale, or any other purpose and brought onto the grounds or into the buildings, will be kept entirely at risk of the owner, who assumes all responsibility for any loss, damage, theft, or accident that may occur. Neither the Appalachian Fair Association, its officers, or agents, will be responsible for any such loss, damage, or theft and it is distinctly understood that exhibitors, concessionaires, and all other persons, firms, or corporations having property on the grounds and desiring protection from such loss or damage must make their own arrangements, therefore. The Appalachian Fair is not responsible for lost or stolen items left in cars or on people attending the fair. Lost & found items may be reported and turned in at the fair office.
- 9. Tickets purchased through a third-party provider are NOT authentic and cannot be guaranteed. All tickets MUST and may only be purchased through the Appalachian Fair website: www.appalachianfair.com or in person at our Box Office. Lost or stolen tickets are the responsibility of the purchaser. All tickets, coupons, etc. become void after the last day of the event.
- 10. Smile! Photos, video, and audio may be taken for promotional purposes. By entering the Appalachian Fair, you consent, waive all rights to royalties and release the Appalachian Fair of any liability. You agree to your likeness being used, published, or reproduced in any and all media which can be used now or in the future, for any purpose by or in connection with the Appalachian Fair.
- 11. Handicap parking is available in Lot 5 on a first-come basis, just outside of Gate 5, for those with valid handicap tags.
- **12.** Washington County EMS will provide emergency medical services. For all first aid and medical emergencies go to the First Aid Station located next to the Appalachian Heritage Museum and the Appalachian Arena or contact fair personnel.
- 13. Security is directed by the Washington County Sheriff's Office. As a safety precaution, the Appalachian Fair along with the WCSO encourages parents to take a photo of your child/children just before entering the fairgrounds. In the event that you become separated, this will allow fair personnel and the WCSO to quickly share a photo of the missing child/children around the grounds with other officers and staff to bring about a quick reunion. Traffic assistance is also provided by the WCSO.

Appalachian Fair's General Rules & Regulations (Cont.)

- **14.** Fair re-entry is not permitted. Handstamps are not used. You will be required to purchase a ticket to re-enter the fairgrounds once you leave the gate, so make sure you bring everything you will need inside the fairgrounds with you.
- 15. E-coli/Salmonella exposure is an inherent risk in any location where food and animals are present. Hand-washing stations and hand sanitizer dispensers have been placed around the grounds and should be used after petting animals or before eating. Guests should take every precaution and evaluate their own health risks. Purchase of a ticket and entry onto the fairgrounds constitutes your understanding of these risks and your willingness to undertake the risk of exposure.
- **16.** COVID exposure is an inherent risk in any public location where people are present. Guests should only attend after evaluating their own health risks. Purchase of a ticket and entry onto the fairgrounds constitutes your understanding of these risks and your willingness to undertake the risk of exposure.
- 17. All property, fixtures, merchandise, etc. of every character, whether entered for exhibition, display, sale, or any other purpose and brought into the grounds or buildings will be kept entirely at risk of the owner, who assumes all responsibility for any loss, damage, theft, or accident that may occur. Neither the Appalachian Fair Association, its officers, or agents, will be responsible for any such loss, damage, theft, or seizure by law enforcement and it is distinctly understood that exhibitors, concessionaires, and all other persons, firms, or corporations having property on the grounds and desiring protection from such loss or damage must make their own arrangements, therefore.
- **18.** The Secretary/Manager of the Appalachian Fair Association shall have supervision and control of all exhibitors, whether in the buildings, arena, or grounds and reserves the right to prescribe the dimensions and regulate the position of all signs, control the distribution of advertising matter, and direct the arrangements of articles on exhibition so far as same may be necessary to secure harmony and attractive appearance. All instructions shall come from him through authorized officials.
- 19. The Appalachian Fair reserves the right to refuse to display any item considered unsuitable for a fair exhibit.
- **20.** Commercial Vendors & Concessionaires: All Commercial Vendors and Concessionaires, together with their employees, assistants, and helpers, must obey the rules, or any other special regulations of the Appalachian Fair Association they have been notified of, and any refusal or neglect to do so will forfeit any rights they may have had by virtue of such privilege or concessions. The Appalachian Fair Association reserves the right to refund in whole or in part, money paid for commercial vendors or concessions space and refuse to allow any party, or article to operate or do business should they or it become objectionable.
- **21.** Special rules governing each department are in addition to the General Rules and are listed in the department's respective catalogue following the list of Appalachian Fair General Rules and Regulations.
- **22.** Competition is open to the world, unless otherwise stated.

<u>Appalachian Fair Youth</u> <u>Scholarship Program</u>

The Appalachian Fair awards two \$1,000 scholarships annually to qualified applicants selected by the Scholarship Committee. The applicant must be a permanent resident of the area of Tennessee served by the Appalachian Fair and either a high school senior or currently enrolled in a college, university, or accredited vocational school. Applicants must have a 2.5 GPA. Applicants must have participated in the Appalachian Fair within the past two years. HOW TO SUBMIT AN ONLINE ENTRY

- Go to the Department page and scroll down to select 'Submit On-line Entries Here'
- Choose the type of entry you are submitting Farm & Home, Livestock, or Youth Log-in and create a username and password by following these steps:

Click the register button

Create your exhibitor ID or username – must be 6-20 characters

Create your password – must be 3-15 characters Enter a security word to help you remember your log-in ID

- Enter your **name**, **address**, **phone number**, & **email address** please fill out everything! then click the register button. Make sure that the address that you list is your correct mailing address. Premium checks will be mailed to the address given.
- Submit your entries

Click 'Add New Exhibit' link

Choose the department you are entering and then the class.

- **For Youth entries, being submitted by a teacher or class** please list your name as: Last name = School name (exp: Appalachian Fair HS); First name = Teacher's name (exp: Jane Doe). Checks issued will list both the school's name and the teacher's name as the Payee. The first name may be left blank with the Teacher's/Class/Student's name listed in the first line of the address if the teacher/student does not want their name listed on the entry ticket.
- 9. For Livestock entries, you will be asked to enter additional information about your entries such as breed, birthdate, animal name, registration number, etc. For other types of entries, simply choose the lot that you

10. You will be asked to confirm that your entry is correct

11. You can then submit any additional entries. A list of your entries will be displayed.

12. Once all of your entries have been submitted, click on the 'checkout' link.

- 13. If an entry fee is required Livestock entry fees you will receive an invoice via the email address provided that should be paid immediately with a credit card or an e-transfer. Livestock exhibitors may request to purchase exhibitor passes as well. Entry fee payments not received by August 1st will result in late fees which are double the entry fee pricing.
- 14. You will get an email confirming the receipt of your entries within 48 hours. If you have any remaining questions or issues, please contact the Appalachian Fair office at 423.477.3211.

Appalachian Fair's Rules & Regulations for Youth Exhibitors

- 1. Entry pre-registration will be accepted from April 1 July 31. Entry forms are available in the fair office, or on our website: www.appalachianfair.com. Completed entry forms may be submitted in person at the fair office, emailed to: appalachianfair@gmail.com, or mailed to: Appalachian Fair, PO Box 8218, Johnson City, TN 37615. Questions? Call us at 423.477.3211 during normal business hours.
- 2. Non-registered entries will be accepted on the day of entry for the respected departments without pre-registration, however, pre-registration is recommended to help with pre-fair set-up needs.
- 3. Entry removal will be held *ONE DAY ONLY* for each area. 4-H removal date is Tuesday, August 26 from 2-6pm; FFA removal date is Sunday, August 24 from 1-4pm; FCCLA removal date is Sunday, August 24 from 2-4pm; and CTE removal date is Sunday, August 24 from 1-4pm. Exhibitors will forfeit premium monies awarded on any exhibit removed before this time unless otherwise stated. Items not picked up from the fair office within 30 days will become the property of the Appalachian Fair.
- 4. Entry tags may be picked up in the fair office prior to drop-off dates for items that have been pre-registered. This will allow you to pre-tag your items prior to the drop-off day for your entry. Place the entry tag in the upper right-hand corner of the item. This will help to speed up the check-in process.
- 5. Exhibitors must be members currently enrolled in the qualified clubs represented by each department.
- 6. All entries must be original and must be entered in the name of the person or school group who did the work.
- 7. Exhibitors may enter only one article in each lot school groups may enter up to three items per lot (if more, please check with the department director). It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to properly select the correct lot for entry of your item. Items previously entered are not eligible for re-entry in any lot. Question? Call the office!
- 8. The Appalachian Fair reserves the right to disqualify ALL entries of any person interfering with the judge, clerks, or the placing of ribbons.
- 9. Premium checks will be distributed on pick-up day if possible; otherwise, they will be mailed to the address on file for the exhibitor. Please make sure that the address, phone, & email information is filled out completely and correct on your exhibitor entry forms. School groups may use a school address for students. Please identify the teacher as well in the address. Teachers/schools wanting premiums to go to their department should register their entries under the name of the teacher/class, so that one check may be written for those awards. ALL PREMIUM CHECKS MUST BE CASHED AND/OR DEPOSITED WITHIN 90 DAYS OF ISSUE ABSOLUTE LAST DAY WILL BE 12/31/25!
- 10. Items entered should be in NEW condition; made/created/completed within the last 12 months (unless otherwise stated in the item description); not soiled or damaged.
- 11. Items containing flammable liquids will not be accepted.
- 12. Only staff will be allowed in the building during judging of non-perishables; or on the stage/backstage area before or during the perishable judging contests.
- 13. For Horticulture, Field Crops, & Floral exhibits all items must be grown by the exhibitor and produced in the current year.
- 14. Judges are instructed not to award premiums unless the items are deemed worthy of the award.
- 15. Items which cannot be appropriately displayed will not be accepted. Maximum size may be limited to 60" in any direction, unless otherwise stated in the Lot descriptions.

- 3. The **4-H, FFA, or FCCLA** member winning the greatest number of blue ribbons at the Appalachian Fair, other than Livestock, will receive a plaque from the Gray Ruritan Club.
- 4. All crops exhibited must be from the students supervised farming program.
- 5. Shop articles exhibited must have been made by the exhibitor in the school shop, during the current school year.
- 6. Only exhibits listed in the catalogue may compete for prize money.
- 7. Students may enter only one exhibit in any lot. Teachers may enter the exhibits under the School/Chapter/Sponsor name on the entry form; and be allowed up to three entries per lot.
- 8. The judge shall have the authority to place ribbons according to the merits of the item. Items not tagged will not be judged.
- 9. All Exhibits may be dropped off on Sunday, August 17 from 1-4pm in the FFA Exhibit Hall. Premium and pick-up day will be Sunday, August 24 from 1-4pm. These dates are non-negotiable and must be adhered to for items to be properly judged. Exhibitors will forfeit premium awards on any exhibit removed before the time stated for removal.
- 10. Rules related to FFA Livestock exhibitions will be found in the Livestock catalog.
- 11. Class B Major Shop Section: FFA members must have constructed the shop exhibit under the instruction and advisement of a Vo-Ag teacher or parent. Entry of items can be made only once. The FFA Chapter should enter any exhibits that have been constructed by more than one FFA member.

Plant collection exhibits should include a minimum of twenty (20) specimens with the scientific and common name for each in a notebook or binder. The Wildlife Plot plant collection should include a minimum of five (5) plants bundled together.
- 15. Class J Agricultural Photography: Photos must be 8"x10" matted on paper may include, but not limited to: foam board, mat board, construction paper, paper, or any other attractive backing.







Exhibitors are required to notify the Appalachian Fair Office of the number of livestock to be entered, along with the department, class, and lot of entry for each animal before the entry deadline. Stabling of livestock cannot be guaranteed unless the request is received by that date. Late entries are subject to penalties that will result in doubling the entry fee to participate. All exhibitors must comply with the Rules & Regulations of the Tennessee Department of Agriculture, the Appalachian Fair's General Rules & Regulations, and the specific rules of each breed which are listed with each Department/Class. The Appalachian Fair reserves the right to bar any animal/exhibitor from showing that does not meet the requirements of their breed show.
- 2. Beef exhibitor entry fees include bedding. Dairy & Sheep exhibitors must provide their own bedding. Grooming chutes are not allowed in the line-up area or in the main aisles.
- 3. **NO** animals will be allowed without health papers and a legible tattoo or flock identification number attached to the ear!! Animal identification is subject to be checked by the Livestock Committee representative or other fair official.
- 4. Junior exhibitors may include anyone that can exhibit their animal **WITHOUT** assistance, unmarried, and under 21 years of age. Exhibitors must not have reached their 21st birthday on or before the day of the show.
- 5. Only a one (1) day supply of feed and hay is allowed in the barn. Exhibitors will be allowed to bring in their feed and hay needed that day before the fair opens. Trucks **MUST** be moved to Lot 3 immediately after unloading. Please follow this procedure to help us ensure the safety of all fair guests. Vehicles moving around on the grounds during fair hours should be avoided for the safety and protection of everyone. Vehicles **must be moved** away from the barn area into the designated parking areas (Lot 3) before 2pm each day. Vehicles left unattended may be towed at the owner's expense.
- 6. **Dogs are NOT** allowed on the fairgrounds during open hours. For everyone's safely, please leave your pets at home.
- 7. Livestock exhibitors should **pre-register and pay before July 31** by completing an entry form. Entry forms may be completed on-line, faxed, or emailed. Fees **MUST** accompany the pre-registration entry forms by personally hand delivering entries with a check, or by paying online through the invoice issued at the time of registration.
- 8. Livestock must be washed in designated areas.
- 9. Fees: Beef: Entry fee of \$15 per head/space which includes bedding, including Junior only entries. Dairy: Entry fee of \$7 per head/space. Sheep: Open Sheep Entry fee of \$5 per head / \$10 per extra pen, Junior Sheep Entry fee of \$2 per head. All Entries Fees shall be doubled after the July 31st deadline.
- 10. Exhibitor passes are available at the reduced rate of \$10 each (valid for all three days of the exhibit). Exhibitor passes will be issued/purchased as follows: One (1) pass issued free for each exhibitor/farm; additional passes may be purchased for \$10 each for the 3-day period up to a total of eight (8) passes per farm. 3-day and 6-day passes are available for purchase in the Ticket Office for \$25 (3-day pass) and \$50 (6-day pass). One day entrance tickets are \$10 each. Exhibitors under 12 years of age do not require a pass to enter.
- 11. Parking: Each farm will receive one (1) loading and unloading pass that will allow them in the gate to unload but will require the vehicle to be moved to Lot 3 following unloading. Each farm will then receive up to a maximum of two (2) passes for Lot 3 parking. If additional parking is needed, please contact the fair office to determine availability.
- 12. A committee selected by members of the Livestock Committee and the Board of Directors will contact and select judges for our Livestock Shows. Suggestions for the following year may be given to a Livestock Committee member.
- 13. Animals must be owned by exhibitors and evidence of registration presented. See individual breed information for specific breed rules.
- 14. Any livestock breed falling below 10 head with 2 exhibitors over a two-year period will be put on probation and the show evaluated by the Livestock Director, Fair Manager, and Livestock Committee. For cattle shows, if there are fewer than 2 exhibitors and 5 animals the animals will be shown as AOB, or the class will not be held. For sheep shows, if there are fewer than 10 sheep and 2 exhibitors per breed class, those animals will be shown as AOB.
- 15. If possible, livestock premium checks will be available at the time of dismissal. If checks are unavailable at that time, they may be picked up in the fair office beginning August 25th. Any checks not picked up will be mailed after September 10th to the address on file for the exhibitor/farm.
- 16. Aisles **MUST BE** cleaned each day before 3pm and MAINTAINED during operating hours. (3pm-10pm Monday-Friday and 10am-10pm on Saturday)
- 17. **Herdsman Awards** will be presented at the end of each Open and Junior Show. The winner in each division (Beef, Dairy, & Sheep) will receive \$60. These awards will be presented based on: Orderliness and cleanliness; Systematic & neat arrangement of foods & storage; Personal appearance of herdsmen; and Observance of rules & regulations.

Appalachian Fair's Livestock Rules & Regulations (Cont.)

- 18. Supreme Champions will be chosen at the conclusion of each show (Beef, Dairy, & Sheep). A banner and cash award will be presented. The Supreme Champion cash awards are sponsored by Farm Credit Services of Mid-America/Rural 1st. The winners will also receive a banner sponsored by the Daniel Boone FFA Alumni.
- 19. Tie-space and stalling will be done based on the number of entries. Tie-space and stalling preferences must be put on the entry form to be taken into consideration. Sheep stalling will be as follows: 3 lambs, or 3 rams, or 2 yearlings will be assigned per pen. Additional pens may be purchased if needed. Moving pen and tie-space assignment signs will result in disqualification from the show.
- 20. All Livestock Exhibitors must wash their animals in their designated areas.
- 21. Open Beef Cattle will be admitted to the fairgrounds beginning Sunday, August 17 and must be in place before 12 noon on Monday, August 18. Junior Beef & Dairy Steers will be admitted Sunday, August 17 prior to 5pm. Animals who will be judged according to weight will be weighed on Sunday, August 17 before 5pm. Livestock exhibitor passes and vehicle passes will be issued at registration.
- 22. **Junior Beef Exhibitors must be in place and registered with the Livestock chairperson before 5pm on Sunday, August 17.** Junior Beef Exhibitors who wish to be dismissed after the Junior Show should notify the Livestock Chairperson to be assigned a dismissal time. No cattle may be removed from the fairgrounds before 9:30pm.
- 23. Space will not be provided for nurse cows.
- 24. Beef Exhibitors: Tie-out will be at 8:30pm. CATTLE MUST REMAIN IN THE BARNS UNTIL 8:30PM!
- 25. Open Beef Exhibitors will be assigned a dismissal time after completion of the Beef Show. All Beef Exhibitors should be dismissed before 11pm. Any exhibitor leaving before their scheduled dismissal time will forfeit any premium money awarded to them.
- 26. Junior and Open Show Dairy cattle and tack will be admitted to the fairgrounds at Gate 3 between 2am and 12Noon on Thursday, August 21. Junior Dairy Commercial Heifers will be admitted between 2am-12Noon on Friday, August 22. Livestock exhibitor passes and vehicle passes will be issued at registration.
- 27. The milking parlor will be open only with the approval of the Tennessee State Veterinarian. At this time, there is a strong possibility that the parlor will be closed during the fair week. All Dairy Exhibitors of lactating cows are advised to make plans to bring their own milking equipment.
- 28. Dairy Cattle Exhibitors will be issued a dismissal time after completion of the Dairy Show on Saturday, August 23. Any exhibitor leaving before their scheduled dismissal time will forfeit any premium money awarded in the shows.
- 29. Sheep Exhibitors and tack will be **admitted to the fairgrounds at Gate 2 between 2am and 12Noon on Thursday**, **August 21.** Animals must be checked in between 3-6pm. Livestock exhibitor passes and vehicle passes will be issued at registration.
- 30. A charge of \$20 will be enforced for all 'tents' erected on the fairgrounds. Only a limited number of spaces will be available and will be marked and assigned. NO TENTS will be allowed in the wash rack area. Reservations for tent spaces will begin on June 1st. Call the fair office at 423.477.3211 to reserve your space.
- 31. Junior Sheep exhibitors who are not participating in the Open Sheep show will be **admitted to the fairgrounds at Gate 2 between 2am and 12Noon on Friday, August 22.** Animals must be checked in between 3-6pm. Junior Market Lambs will be weighed between 3-6pm.
- 32. Sheep exhibitors will be issued a dismissal time after completion of the Sheep Show on Saturday, August 23. Any exhibitor leaving before their scheduled dismissal time will forfeit any premium money awarded in the shows.
- 33. ALL PREMIUM CHECKS MUST BE CASHED AND/OR DEPOSITED WITHIN NINTY (90) DAYS. All Premiums whatsoever not claimed before December 31st of 2025 shall be deemed forfeited to the management of the Appalachian Fair Association, Inc.
- 34. The Appalachian Fair will not be responsible for printing errors in the catalog books. Online check-in information available through the website (www.appalachianfair.com) will take precedence over the printed catalog.

Enclosed is a summary of Tennessee regulations and health requirements for livestock and poultry at fair shows, exhibitions, other shows and rodeos. **Special Comments:**

omments:
It is expected that all exhibitors bring only healthy animals to fairs and exhibitions. Although state and federal animal health officials will be performing as many inspections as possible, **fair officials are responsible** for ensuring that all animals entering fairs for exhibition are in overall good health and are accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Animals showing clinical signs of contagious disease should be sent home immediately. Violations should be reported to the state veterinarian or her agent.

Certificate(s) of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) are to accompany all animal(s) to the respective shows with the exception of in-state Tennessee equine and poultry. In-state Tennessee equine six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding type (12) months. Poultry except here is a practive test for

the preceding twelve (12) months. Poultry assembled at shows or exhibitions should be accompanied by evidence of a negative test for Pullorum-Typhoid within 90 days or **be tested on-site prior to exhibition following strict biosecurity procedures** or originate directly from a flock which has been certified as Pullorum-Typhoid Clean under the Tennessee Poultry Improvement Plan. As part of increased awareness and surveillance for Avian Influenza and other poultry diseases, the physical appearance of all birds should be assessed at the time testing is conducted.

3. Certificates of Veterinary Inspection issued in satisfaction of these Tennessee Fair Regulations shall be good for 90 days for Tennessee livestock only.

Certificates of Veterinary Inspection demonstrate that the animal showed no signs of contagious disease at the time of veterinary exam and CVI issuance. Animals developing signs of disease after inspection but during the period the CVI is valid are still subject to rules refusing entry of animals with contagious diseases to exhibitions and shows.

5.

Please note that exhibition requirements for out-of-state livestock are the same as regular import requirements.

Warts, ringworm, scabies, contagious ecthyma (sore mouth), foot rot, cutaneous fungal and bacterial infections (i.e. club lamb disease, caseous lymphadenitis, pink eye/conjunctivitis) are considered contagious and infectious diseases and are NOT permissible.

All out-of-state poultry must originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and a H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative official Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

Also, please note that if highly pathogenic avian influenza is detected in Tennessee or a neighboring state, commingling of poultry at fairs and exhibitions may be suspended.

Below is a summary of recommendations for fair management by the National Assembly of State Animal Health Officials and the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians to better protect fair attendees from disease:

Provide easy access to hand washing stations.

- Post informational signage that includes the following messages: 0
 - No eating or drinking in the animal areas.
 - Wash hands frequently.
 - No pacifiers, sipping cups or strollers in the animal exhibition areas.
- Discourage sleeping in the animal exhibition areas. 0
- If human or swine influenza-like-illness is associated with the exhibition, animal health and public health officials should be notified 0 immediately.
- People who have influenza-like illness should leave the exhibition immediately and seek medical care. They should advise their health care provider about their fair attendance.

o People at high risk for developing severe complications from influenza should limit their exposure to swine.

Also, be aware of the potential exposure of fair attendees to Salmonella and E. coli 0157 from animals exhibited on the fairgrounds.

Please retain this material for reference during the 2025 fair season.

Accepted Official Identification Types by Species for Fairs/Exhibition

Animals being imported from out of state must meet import requirements

Bovine:

-840 RFID tag or; -USDA Metal tag (if placed before November 5, 2024) or; -Registration Tattoo – Registration papers must be submitted with the CVI to our office and must travel with the animal to exhibitions with their CVI or; -Sufficient description to identify each animal individually***

Swine:

-USDA metal tag or; -840 RFID tag or; -Registration Tattoo – Registration papers must be submitted with the CVI to our office and must travel with the animal to exhibitions with their CVI or; -Ear Notches – Registration papers must be submitted with the CVI to our office and must travel with the animal to exhibitions with their CVI or; -Sufficient description to identify each animal individually***

Sheep and Goats:

-Scrapie Tag or; -Registration Tattoo – Registration papers must be submitted with the CVI to our office and must travel with the animal to exhibitions with their CVI or; -Electronic Implant – Registration papers must be submitted with the CVI to our office and must travel with the animal to exhibitions with their CVI.

***Sufficient Description to Identify each Animal — Animal should have obvious unique identifiers including markings or scars that would make the animal distinguishable from all other animals of the same sex and species regardless of age. This is only applicable to Tennessee origin animals shown at Tennessee fairs.

TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE DIVISION OF ANIMAL HEALTH

SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS I. GENERAL $_$

All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.

All livestock (except poultry and equine) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection

with individual permanent identification. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only – out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue.)

No animal showing clinical signs of infections or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions.

It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

II. LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

[Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

A. SWINE: All swine which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal.

B. CATTLE: All cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual permanent, official identification. Lactating Dairy Cattle residing within Tennessee and moving to an exhibition, show, or sale within Tennessee ovement) do not require pre-movement H5N1 test

POULTRY: (1) Sponsor of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at lease **thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition**. (2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE: Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test C.

D. within the preceding twelve (12) months.

SHEEP: (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions, or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

GOATS: (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, exposition, or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulation, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

CAMELIDS: Camelids must have an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01(1).

CAPTIVE CERVIDAE: Captive Cervidae must have an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01(1). (1) CWD susceptible species must have two forms of identification (including official USDA ID). (2) CWD susceptible species must not move from a CWD affected County to a non-CWD affected County.

III. LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows:

ALL SPECIES (except poultry): Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.

CATTLE: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows: (1) Tuberculosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of tuberculosis. (2) Brucellosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of brucellosis. Test eligible cattle – Intact male or female cattle eighteen (18) months or older. (Vaccinates and non-vaccinates). (3) Per the USDA Federal Order, all lactating dairy cattle originating outside the State of Tennessee must have a negative H5N1 test within days of interstate movement. Lactating dairy cattle can move back to the state of origin within ten (10) days of test

SWINE: No testing requirements for swine unless originating from a region not considered free of Brucellosis and Pseudorabies. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES: Animals six (6) months of age or older – negative equine infectious anemia (Coggins) test within twelve POÚLTRY: Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock or be accompanied by evidence E.

F.

POULTRY: Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days. SHEEP: (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions, or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions, or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. CAMELIDAE: Same requirements as for cattle.

CERVIDAE: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows: (1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle. (2) Tuberculosis: (a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or (b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two (2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry. (3) Two forms of identification (including official USDA official ID). (4) CWD: (a) CWD susceptible species must be from a CWD Certified Herd.

NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).

Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter and shall notify the State Veterinarian or her agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or her agent upon request. These rules IV. constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibitions managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.

Recommendations for Exhibitors of Lactating Dairy Cows Related to H5N1/Avian Influenza of Dairy Cattle Adapted from USDA APHIS Guidance (May 2024) **Before the Event**

- Become familiar with requirements for interstate movement as well as any state specific exhibition requirements prior to the event.

 O Rules and Regulations Governing Movement and Handling of Livestock at Fairs and Exhibitions

 - Federal Order Requiring Testing for and Reporting of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) in Livestock 0
 - APHIS strongly recommends minimizing movement of lactating dairy cattle as much as possible, with special attention to 0 evaluating risk and factoring that risk into movement decisions.
 - Consult with your veterinarian to discuss risk.
 - Lactating dairy cattle moving interstate to an exhibition, show, or sale must have a negative test result from samples collected within 7 days of movement. These animals may travel to their home herd using the same negative test result provided the exhibition, show, or sale does not exceed 10 days of length.
 - Lactating Dairy Cattle residing within Tennessee and moving to an exhibition, show, or sale within Tennessee (intrastate movement) do not require pre-movement testing.
- Become familiar with signs of influenza in cattle and work with your veterinarian to ensure your animals are free of illness.
 - Signs of influenza in dairy cattle include decreased milk production; reduced appetite; thickened, discolored milk; lethargy; fever; and/or dehydration.
 - If you have any animals with clinical signs on the premises, do not move other animals off the premises.
- Ensure that any people that will be attending the fair or exhibition do not have any symptoms of illness.
- Clean and disinfect any equipment you will be bringing with you to the exhibition such as:
 - Feed equipment
 - Cleaning utensils
 - Grooming equipment 0
 - Vehicle and Trailer (inside and out)
 - 0 Portable milking equipment
 - Use approved disinfectants that are safe for human and animal contact: https://www.epa.gov/pesticide-registration/list-m- registered-antimicrobial-products-label-claims-avian-influenza
- Avoid transporting animals from different premises in the same trailer.

During the Event

- Keep copies of certificates of veterinary inspection (CVIs), vaccination records, and test results on hand and readily available.
- Observe cattle regularly for signs of influenza-like illness (e.g. decreased milk production; reduced appetite; thickened, discolored milk; lethargy; fever; and/or dehydration).
 - Report sick cattle to the show veterinarian and exhibition organizers.
- Sick animals should be immediately removed from the exhibition or moved to a designated temporary isolation area. Sick lactating dairy cattle can be evaluated on site before leaving the premises OR can be sent home and state animal health officials and your veterinarian should be contacted for follow up testing.
 - Interaction with the sick animal should be limited to only people caring for the animal.
 - Dedicated personal protective equipment (PPE) such as disposable gloves, gown/coveralls, and boots or boot covers should be worn by people caring for sick animals.
 - No treatment supplies, feed or water, portable milking equipment and supplies, or grooming supplies should be shared between sick animals and healthy animals.
 - Additional precautions should be taken by those caring for sick animals to minimize the opportunity for disease transmission to other cattle or people. Precautions could include hand washing before putting on and after taking off PPE, changing clothes and changing boots between activities.
- Follow the event's biosecurity plan. Avoid close contact with other exhibitor's animals and avoid nose-to-nose contact between animals.
- Follow the event guidance for handling milk from lactating cows.
- Do not share tools, feed and water, portable milking equipment and supplies, or grooming supplies with other exhibitors.

After the Event

- Isolate and observe animals daily for illness after returning home and before allowing contact with other animals.
 - 30-day isolation of lactating dairy cattle from other livestock is recommended.
 - Do not share equipment between show cattle and other animals at home.
- Discuss the need to test animals returning from an exhibition or fair for influenza A with your veterinarian.
- Consult your state or local public health department if exhibitors or family members develop influenza-like illness (e.g., fever or chills, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches, tiredness, and/or vomiting and diarrhea) or conjunctivitis (red eyes) following the event. Testing and treatment for influenza A may be available. The TN Dept of Health can be reached at 615-741-7247 (24/7).
- Clean and disinfect all equipment you took to the show.
 - Use approved disinfectants that are safe for human and animal contact. (See link above)

- Angus Exhibitor Rules & Information

 1. Only registered Angus cattle that meet the age requirements listed within this classification are eligible to receive premium participation and be counted in the total number of head shown. Champion and Reserve Champion placings are not counted in number of head shown. The American Angus Association, 3201 Fredrick Avenue, St. Joseph, MO will participate in premiums offered for open Angus breeding cattle classes/lots according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expenses and will be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors. A minimum of 50 head must be shown in the open class division to receive premium participation for the following year. 2024 show total was 21 head so the 2025 show will not see the benefits of the American Angus Association (AAA) premium assistance. Exhibitors are subject to the AAA rules found in the Breeders Reference Guide: Part 2: Association Rules: Rule 800 Series; including Rules 800-810 found at angus.org.
- Any female that qualifies for female classes/lots in the Association's standard classifications are not eligible to show in the cow/calf lots. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class/lot. Any female shown with a calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, no more than 280 days of age on show day, and the calf must be registered by show day and have proof of registration at check-in.
- Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the AAA available for inspection at the time of check-in for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the AAA pedigree look-up. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze branded marks, or hot branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified (tattooed/branded) and rechecked at the show.
- Only one person at a time shall lead an animal in the show ring.
- Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes use of chinstraps, covering white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair) except for false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp, or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.
- No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in the designated line-up area.
- Authorized representative(s) of the AAA or the Appalachian Fair have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as the AAA Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from this livestock show if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.
- Any lot listed in this classification which exceeds 15 head per lot should be broken into smaller lots. This should be accomplished by dividing the lot as evenly as possible without splitting animals with the same birth date. Lot breaks will be at the discretion of the Show Directors and in compliance of the AAA rules.
- Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Cow/Calf Pair do not show for Grand Champion Female and are ineligible to compete in the Get-of-Sire, Junior Get-of-Sire, and Breeder's Six Head lots.

At the end of the Open competitions a Supreme Champion Female and a Supreme Champion Bull will be awarded; chosen from the Grand Champion winners in each class. An Adult Herdsman Award will also be presented at the end of the competitions. See page 41 for award requirements.

- 1. All animals must be registered as the property of the exhibitor in the records of the American Shorthorn Association (ASA) by the time of the fair or show. Please refer to specific show guidelines for Junior Show ownership. Junior Show deadline for ownership is July 1, 2025.
- 2. All Shorthorn and ShorthornPlus are subject to a tattoo inspection, parentage DNA testing, and age inspection and/or females 20 months of age on day of show are subject to a blood test to prove pregnancy if deemed necessary by the ASA. The decision of an examining veterinarian is final.
- 3. The fair **must** adhere to the show divisions regardless of the entry numbers. Age divisions (i.e.: Late Spring Calf, Early Spring Calf, Junior Calf, Senior Calf, Intermediate, Junior, Senior, Cow/Calf) are not flexible.
- 4. ASA will accept electronic registration papers at ASA sanctioned shows for check-in, unless otherwise stated by the hosting show rules.
- 5. **Cow/Calf** is a division that is included with all other female divisions for selection of Grand & Reserve Grand Champion Female.
- 6. Females 20 months of age on the day of the show need to have a pregnancy verification signed by an accredited, non-owner veterinarian at the time the female is processed for the show. If verification cannot be produced upon request, the exhibitor is allowed to find a qualified veterinarian to verify pregnancy prior to time of show.
- 7. Senior Yearling Females who have calved will show based on age. The exhibitor can exhibit the female with or without the calf at side. If a Purebred Female has a ShorthornPlus calf at side, it is NOT eligible for the Purebred Shorthorn Show, however it is eligible for the ShorthornPlus Show.

Entries with registrations "pending" or illegible tattoos or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificate at check-in time are ineligible for competition. Entries in these classes/lots are accepted with the understanding that the exhibitor agrees to abide by the rule in all respects.
- 2. For show results to be included in the calculations for the AHA show rewards program, regional shows must have at least 25 AHA registered head exhibited to qualify.

An approved NALF Medal of Excellence Level II Award Program

NALF Standard Rules and Regulations for the Exhibition of Limousin Cattle & Lim-Flex Cattle

- Animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation (NALF).
- All cattle shown including calves at the side of the dam must be A) 75% Limousin (NALF percentage, not actual) or greater as indicated on orange NALF registration certificates; or B) Purple-papered Lim-Flex cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates. Percentage, fullblood, purebred, and Lim-Flex cattle shall compete in the same classes/lots and championships.
- If a show does not abide by the NALF MOE show rules exhibitors will not be awarded points for that show.
- Animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and match the registration certificates. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or cannot be read upon initial processing, it will be ineligible to show and not be allowed to return with a new or corrected tattoo.
- To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows NALF reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following: A) Any use of paints, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders, or other substances; animals may be subject to a white-towel test; B) The addition of any hair or hair-like substances, including false tail heads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed); C) The cutting, tearing, or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue to alter the shape of the animal or injection of any gas, solid, or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation; D) Any products, solutions or liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. That includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants, and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method. EXCEPTION: In the case of severely sick or dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent or a NALF representative. That exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.
- Bulls older than one (1) year must show with a nose-lead. The Limousin Show Superintendent and the show
- management reserve the right to disqualify animals deemed unmanageable.

 Cow/Calf Pair: Cows must be purple-papered Lim-Flex or at least 75% Limousin with natural calf at side. Calf must be registered Limousin, percentage Limousin or Lim-Flex and not more than 250 days old on the date of
- Protests against exhibitors, individual animals or fitting violations must be submitted in writing, signed by five (5) active members of the NALF and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours of the show completion.
- NALF reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development and to collect DNA samples from any animal.
- 10. Class/lot size shall be to the discretion of the show superintendent and may not contain more than 20 head. The given lots may be split or combined only within their given division. Calves exhibited alongside dams in the Cow/Calf division are eligible to show as individuals.
- 12. Animals shown must be solid red or black above the flanks, excluding birthmarks.
- 13. Additional performance-data-submission requirements must be met before December 1 to receive Medal of Excellence points. See 'Other Requirements' for Level II MOE points to be awarded at www.NALF.com.

At the end of the Open competitions a Supreme Champion Female and a Supreme Champion Bull will be awarded; chosen from the Grand Champion winners in each class. An Adult Herdsman Award will also be presented at the end of the competitions. See page 41 for award requirements.

Premier Exhibitor: Exhibitor must have a minimum of 3 entries exhibited to qualify. If the exhibitor has more than 3 head exhibited in the show, then their top 5 placing animals will be considered in the calculations.



Department 211 – Class H: Charolais Other Breeds Exhibitor Rules and Information

- 1. All animals to be eligible for an Open Charolais Breeding Class must be purebred and registered with the American-International Charolais Association (AICA). Only bona fide, original certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership. Animals registered in the AICA Colored Division Registry must meet the parameters of the AICA Color Card.
- 2. All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Refer to AICA Article XV, Paragraph B, Point 2. Use of artificial tailheads is not permitted. The use of a coloring agent, flock, and/or powder is prohibited.
- 3. Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.
- 4. Bulls, from classes 38, 39, 42 & 43, must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.
- 5. All animals shown in individual lots must be weaned, with the exception of the Cow/Calf Lot with calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2024. Calf at side must be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved before September 1, 2023, must show in an individual female lot appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.
- 6. All females 20 months and older exhibited at AICA sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.
- 7. All Exhibits of Charolais breeding cattle shall be governed by the AICA rules and regulations, Article XV, titled exhibition of animals. The inspection of exhibit cattle is specified in Article XV, Paragraph C, of the association rules and regulations and non-compliance of exhibit inspection is specified in Paragraph D of the same Article XV.
- 8. Lot 21: Cow/Calf Rules: Calf must be cow's natural calf, not embryo transplant. Calf to be no more than 250 days of age by day of show. Calf must be purebred and registered with the AICA. No age restriction on cow. Calf not eligible to compete in individual calf classes if shown with dam. Pair is eligible for Grand or Reserve Grand Champion Female. Cow and/or calf may be included in group class entries as individual, not as a pair comprising a single animal unit.

At the end of the Open competitions a **Supreme Champion Female** and a **Supreme Champion Bull** will be awarded; chosen from the Grand Champion winners in each class. An **Adult Herdsman Award** will also be presented at the end of the competitions. See page 41 for award requirements.

Department 221 – Junior Beef Cattle Exhibitor Rules and Information

- Junior Show Exhibitors will include anyone who can exhibit their animal WITHOUT assistance, unmarried, and 21 years
 of age or younger as of the day of the show. The Junior Show is open to any out-of-state exhibitors that also meet these
 requirements.
- 1. Entry forms for the Junior Beef Show are available in this catalog or on our website: www.appalachianfair.com. Entry forms may be completed (completely) online or delivered to the fair office prior to the **entry deadline of July 31**. Fees MUST accompany the pre-registration entry forms by personally hand delivering entries with a check, or by paying online through the invoice issued at the time of registration. **Junior Show only** exhibitors must also provide payment for their bedding at the time of entry. Late entry fees will be doubled.
- 2. Exhibitors must show their own animal unless the exhibitor has more than one animal in the same lot or has an approved absence by the committee chairperson. Substitute show person must be a junior member as defined above. Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.
- 3. All animals entered in the Junior Beef Show must be registered in the name of the junior exhibitor or transferred to the junior member in whose name the entry is made by July 1 prior to the show. Registration papers or transfer certificate properly executed must be presented to the chairperson of the show when cattle arrive at the fairgrounds. Lease contracts will be accepted provided they are presented at the time of entry, and provided they were legally entered into on or before July 1 prior to show. If leasing animals, exhibitors must show proof of lease to show.
- All cattle to be exhibited in the junior division must conform to the health rules and regulations as outlined and required by the Division of Animal Disease Control.
- 5. Cattle must be in place and registered with the Livestock Director before 4pm on Sunday, August 17.
- 6. Proper dress should be followed when entering the show ring. Shirt tucked in with jeans or slacks. Boots are recommended in the show ring.
- 7. Feed must be furnished by the exhibitor and the animals kept in their assigned space. Space will not be provided for nurse
- 8. If a breed has fewer than 2 exhibitors and 5 animals registered, these animals will be shown as Any Other Breed.
- 9. The Appalachian Fair reserves the right to bar any animal/exhibitor from showing that does not meet the requirements of the show. Entry into any class/lot of this show binds the exhibitor to all regulations pertaining thereto.

Exhibitors must comply with the rules and health regulations of the Tennessee Department of Agriculture, their respective breed association, and to the General Rules of the Appalachian Fair as set forth in this catalog.

Rules that apply to Junior Angus Exhibitors: Junior Beef:

The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, MO will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for Junior Angus as included in its standard show classifications, according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself.

- 1. A **minimum of 15** head must be shown in the Junior Angus heifer lots to receive American Angus Association premium participation. The show is not required to have all lots to be eligible for premiums. For 2024 we had 19 head exhibited, so premium assistance will be received for 2025. Junior Angus 1st & 2nd Place Winners will receive an extra \$5 of premium each.

Department 231 – Open Dairy Show Dairy Exhibitor Rules and Information

The Appalachian Fair will host a One-Day Dairy Show. The Junior and Open shows will be held simultaneously. Each class/lot will be judged and placed as an Open Show class/lot. Following the Open Show placings, Junior Show exhibitors will be asked to pull forward and receive their Junior Show awards. Therefore, if showing in the Junior Show, a junior exhibitor must be exhibiting the animal.

- 1. No animal can be entered or exhibited unless recorded in the recognized books of record for their respective breeds. Exhibitors must produce a Certificate of Registry at the request of the department chairperson. Animals that cannot be identified by tattoo, ear tags, or color markings shall not be eligible to be shown.
- 2. In the Best Udder class/lots, where there are less than three animals shown, premium awards will not be automatic, but are at the discretion of the Judge.
- 3. The milking parlor will be open only with the approval of the TN State Veterinarian. At this time, there is a strong possibility that the parlor will remain closed during fair week. All Dairy Exhibitors of lactating cows are advised to make plans to bring their own milking equipment.
- 4. Cows must be entered as dry or milking at the time of registration. No changes will be accepted upon arrival!
- 5. Exhibitor is defined as the owner recorded on the Registration Certificate. For the Breeder's Herd class/lot and for the Premier Exhibitors class/lot the definition will be interpreted to include the exhibitor and active 4-H or FFA projects that are maintained on the exhibitor's dairy.
- 6. The Breeder is defined as the breeder recorded on the Registration Certificate. For the Breeder's Herd and Premier Breeder class/lot the interpretation will be that 'bred by' animals must possess the same prefix or have the same individuals listed as the breeder.

Show Ring Code of Ethics for all Breeds:

The showing of registered dairy cattle is an important part of the promotion, merchandising, and breeding programs of many breeders. Additionally, it is an important part of the program of the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association to stimulate and sustain interest in breeding registered dairy cattle. This relates to both spectators and exhibitors. In this connection, the PDCA believes that it is in the best interest of the breeders of registered dairy cattle to maintain a reputation of integrity and to present a wholesome and progressive image of their cattle in the show ring. It recognizes that there are certain practices in proper care and management of dairy cattle, which are necessary while moving dairy cattle to and between shows that are advisable to keep them in sound, healthy condition so that they might be presented in the show ring in a natural, normal appearance and condition. Conversely, it recognizes certain practices in the cataloging, handling, and presentation of cattle in the show ring that are acceptable. The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being unethical in the showing of registered dairy cattle:

- 1. Misrepresenting the age and/or milking status of the animal for the class/lot in which it is shown. In any female classes/lots, animals may not be exhibited that are in milk due to unnaturally induced lactation.
- 2. Balancing the udder by any means other than by leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters.
- 3. Setting the teats with a mechanical contrivance or with the use of chemical preparation.
- 4. Treating or massaging any part of the animal's body, particularly the udder, internally or externally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or other substance to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation
- 5. Minimizing the effects of cramping by feeding or injecting drugs, depressants or applying packs or using any artificial contrivance or therapeutic treatment excepting natural exercise.

- **Department 231: Open Dairy Show (Cont.)**Blocking nerves to the foot to prevent limping by injecting drugs. Striking the animal to cause swelling in a depressed area. Surgery of any kind performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not included are the removal of warts, teats, and horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming hooves. Insertion of foreign materials under skin.
- Changing color of hair at any point, spot, or area on animal's body.
- The use of alcoholic beverages in the feed or administered as a drench.
- Administration of a drug of any kind or description internally or externally prior to entering the show ring, except for treating a recognized disease or injury and for tranquilizing bulls that may otherwise be dangerous or females in heat. For this Code, the term 'drug' shall mean any substance, the sale, possession, or use of which is controlled by license under federal, state, and local laws or regulations and any substance commonly used by the medical or veterinary professions which affect the circulatory, respiratory, or central nervous system of a cow.
- 10. Criticizing or interfering with the Judge, show management, or other exhibitors while in the show ring or other conduct detrimental to the breed or show.

At the end of the Open Dairy competitions a **Supreme Champion Cow** and a **Supreme Champion Heifer** will be awarded; chosen from the Grand Champion winners in each class. An Adult Herdsman Award will also be presented at the end of the competitions. See page 41 for award requirements.

- All animals must be registered. Only animals officially recorded in the name of the exhibitor before August 1 on the Registration Certificate or on official transfer/lease contracts may be shown. Applications for registration or transfer will not be accepted. No joint ownership will be accepted.
- Proper dress shall always be followed in the show ring: modest shirts tucked in with jeans or trousers and shoes. Boots are strongly recommended.
- In keeping with the basic philosophy of The Purebred Dairy Cattle Association, ethics are an individual responsibility of the owner of each animal shown. Violations of this code are subject to the disciplinary provisions of the appropriate dairy breed association. Partnership animals will be included if they are housed at the breeder's farm.

Exhibitors are subject to all rules and health regulations of the Tennessee Department of Agriculture, and the Appalachian Fair as set forth in this catalog. Please see the TN State Veterinarian guidelines on page 45 regarding lactating dairy cattle H5N1 testing and procedures.

- 1. All animals entered must be purebred and must be registered with their respective breed association in the name of the exhibitor or transferred to the exhibitor before July 31. Registration certificates or transfer certificates, properly executed, must be presented to the chairperson of the show when the sheep arrive at the fairgrounds.
- 2. Exhibitors are allowed **no more than two (2) entries** in any one (1) Lot. In **Lots** 7* & 8*, exhibitors may enter a total of two (2) yearling ewes. They may be entered in the same class/lot or in a different class/lot.
- 3. Open sheep entry fees are \$5 per head. See page 41, rule 10 for information related to the purchase and issuance of exhibitor passes and parking passes. Fees MUST accompany the pre-registration entry forms by personally hand delivering entries with a check, or by paying online through the invoice issued at the time of registration.
- 4. Sheep will be admitted to the fairgrounds through Gate 2 from <u>2am-12Noon on Thursday</u>, <u>August 21 and MUST be checked in with a chairperson between 3-6pm</u> that day. Livestock exhibitor passes and vehicle passes will be issued at registration. After this time all exhibitors must present an exhibitor pass and vehicle pass to enter the fairgrounds or any of the parking areas.
- 5. A minimum of 10 sheep and 2 exhibitors must be registered per breed class for a breed show to occur. If the minimum is not met all animals registered will show as Any Other Breed.
- 6. Exception to age classification listed under the number may be made when an exhibitor wishes to enter a younger animal in an older age classification. In no case may an older animal be entered in a younger classification than its birthdate would permit.
- 7. **Sheep stalling will be as follows: 3 lambs, or 3 rams, or 2 yearlings will be assigned per pen.** Additional pens may be purchased if needed. Moving pen assignment signs will result in disqualification from the show.
- 8. Tents or personal belongings may not block or hinder passage through the aisleways or entry to the barns. A charge of \$20 will be enforced for all tents erected on the fairgrounds. A limited number of spaces will be available and assigned. NO TENTS will be allowed in the wash rack area. Reservations for tent spaces will begin on June 1st by calling the fair office.

At the end of the competitions a **Supreme Champion Ewe** and a **Supreme Champion Ram** will be awarded; chosen from the Grand Champion winners of each breed. An **Adult Herdsman Award** will also be presented at the end of the competitions. See page 9 for award requirements.

Rules and Information

- 1. Junior Show Exhibitors **will include** anyone who can exhibit their animal WITHOUT assistance; unmarried; and 21 years of age or younger as of January 1 of the current year. The Junior Show is open to any out-of-state exhibitors that also meet these requirements.
- 2. Application for entry must be made on a regulation entry form or online at www.appalachianfair.com. Entry forms and payments **MUST** be received by July 31.
- 3. Animals not participating in the Open Show will be admitted at Gate 2 to the fairgrounds on Friday, August 22 from 2am to 12Noon and MUST be checked in with a chairperson between 3-6pm that day.
- 4. All animals entered in the Junior Sheep Show must be purebred and must be **registered** in the name of the exhibitor, or officially transferred to the exhibitor before July 31. A registration certificate or a transfer certificate, properly executed, must be presented to the chairperson of the show when the sheep arrive on the fairgrounds. Lease contracts will be accepted at the time of entry, provided they were legally entered into on or before July 1, 2025. Leased animals will not be eligible to show in the Senior Showmanship competition unless proof of lease is provided.
- 5. Exhibitors are allowed **NO MORE than three (3) entries** in any one (1) lot with the following exception: In **Lots** 7* & **8*** exhibitors may enter a total of two (2) yearling ewes. They may be in the same lot or a different lot.
- 6. All junior exhibitors must have an exhibitor pass. *See page 41, rule 10 for information related to the purchase and issuance of exhibitor passes and parking passes.* Junior show entry fees are \$2 per head. Fees <u>MUST</u> accompany the pre-registration entry forms by personally hand delivering entries with a check, or by paying online through the invoice issued at the time of registration.
- 7. Exhibitors may not receive two (2) premiums in Lots 4, 9, 16, 21, & 22 until all exhibitors have received at least one (1) premium in these lots.
- 8. Exception to age classification listed under the lot number may be made when an exhibitor wishes to enter a younger animal in an older age classification. In no case may an older animal be entered in a younger classification than the animal's birthday would permit.
- 9. The exhibitor will furnish all feed and bedding for their animals and make sure that their animals remain in their assigned space.
- 10. Proper dress should be followed when entering the show ring. Shirts tucked in with jeans or slacks and shoes. Boots are highly recommended.
- 11. All Open Sheep Show Rules apply to Junior entries.

A Junior Herdsman Award will be presented at the end of the competitions. See page 41 for award requirements.

Sheep Breed Classification Standards

Animals must meet their respective breed/type standards in order to be eligible for that particular breed. This is accomplished through a breed classification/sift during check-in of the show in which a qualified breed sifter evaluates the sheep on how they follow the below breed standards. In the Market Lamb and Commercial Ewe competitions, any animal determined to not meet breed standards will be moved to the respective Blackface Crossbred division. The decisions made by the breed classifier are considered final.

- <u>Southdowns:</u> Three (3) of the following will result in disqualification: Solid white hair color on muzzle; Pink nose; Excessive white on face, ears, or legs; Completely slick ears; Pink or striped hooves; Black spots in the fleece, not hide; Open pool on the head; speckled face or legs. Absolute disqualification: Solid black in color; Horns or solid scurs; Double muscled.
- Oxfords: Three (3) of the following will result in disqualification: Long droopy black ears; Bare face; Black spots in wool or hair; Inverted eyelids; Speckled face and/or hair; White spots on the ear. Absolute disqualification: Horns or solid scurs; Lack of top-knot; A steep hip and a genetic tendency to be double-muscled.
- <u>Dorsets:</u> Three (3) of the following will result in disqualification: Any dark colored spots in the hair or wool; Large drooping ears; Fine textured, silky hair covering; Absence of hair covering in typical areas; Dark colored septum dividing the tissue between the nostrils; Dark colored lining of the nose or mouth. Absolute disqualification: All-black, colored, or spotted (Holstein-type) lambs.
- **Hampshires:** Three (3) of the following will result in disqualification: Broken wool cap; Very fine or thin hair on face or legs; Scurs; Excessive (more than 25%) white hair on jaw or legs; Excessively dark or blue hide; Inadequate wool covering head and legs; Speckled face so that the lamb appears to be a "brockle". Absolute disqualification: Horns; Lack of a wool cap; Steep hip and genetic tendency to be double-muscled.
- <u>Suffolks:</u> Three (3) of the following will result in disqualification: Non-black hair on head, ears, or legs; Wool on the head; Wool below the hock and knee; Ears that are short or otherwise not "bell-shaped". Absolute disqualification: Horns.
- <u>Tunis:</u> Three (3) of the following will result in disqualification: White blaze on face below the eye ridges; White or black face and/or legs; Mottling or white socks on any leg; Non-pink nose or tongue; Wool with colored fiber. Absolute disqualification: Horns or scurs.
- **Shropshire:** Three (3) of the following will result in disqualification: Broken wool cap; Coarse or long, droopy ears; Coarse or Roman nose; Any white on the face, ears, or legs; Legs completely bare of wool below the knees and hocks; Black armpits or black spots in the skin or wool. Absolute disqualifications: Horns; Lack or a wool cap; A steep hip and a genetic tendency to be double-muscled.
- **Katahdin:** Three (3) of the following will result in disqualification: Scurs; Short, Barrel, or extended bodies; Sway or humped back; Exceptionally large head or parrot mouth; Long thin necks; Short, over long, or sickle hocked legs. Absolute disqualifications: Weak or fallen pasterns; Docked tails; Shoulders wider than rear quarters; Horned ewes; Rams with complete absence of a mane.
- White-face Crossbred: Must be the offspring of at least one white-face parent (either the sire or the dam) or of a white-face cross ram and a white-face cross ewe. Must have predominantly white hair on its head and ears (approximately 50% white) and should have visible speckling on ears, face, jaw, flank, and/or legs or piebald marking.

 - c. Jelly A clear, cooked mixture of fruit juice, sugar, and usually pectin.
 - d. Marmalade a jellied fruit preserve that contains pieces of rind, usually citrus fruit.
 - e. Butter A thick, dark preserve made by slowly cooking fruit, sugar, spices, and cider together.
- 5. Scoring for Jam & Jelly: appearance, natural color of fruit, clean sparkling, transparent, free from sediment 50 points; consistency, firm enough to hold shape, yet tender and quivery 40 points; containers 10 points.




